

**Report on the Use of Pupil Premium
Ditton Lodge Community Primary School (April 2013-March 2014)**

<p>Overview</p>	<p>The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to pupils from Reception to Year 6 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.</p> <p>From April 2012, the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.</p>
<p>Total amount allocated to the school for the current academic year</p>	<p>2013/2014 - £8400</p>
<p>How will the money be spent this academic year?</p>	<p>A percentage of this income is spent on providing TA support to identified learners to raise attainment. A percentage is set aside to allocate funds for curriculum enhancement/enrichment activities e.g. paying an after school club fee; subsidising a theatre trip; subsidising a residential trip; subsidising educational visits.</p>
<p>Statement about the effect of the expenditure on the educational attainment of those pupils who were eligible for pupil premium</p>	<p>Being able to provide these opportunities enables eligible pupils to access the curriculum at a level that is appropriate to them and to make, at least, expected progress. It enables pupils to feel included in school extra curricular activities and gives them an increased sense of belonging. In turn, this impacts on well being as identified children feel a complete part of the school community.</p>
