Phonics

- We have started Sounds Write Phonics
- Sounds Write is a reading programme which begins with teaching the sounds in the language and moves from the sounds to the written word.
- We will update you each week via Google Classroom so that you can support your child at home with their learning.

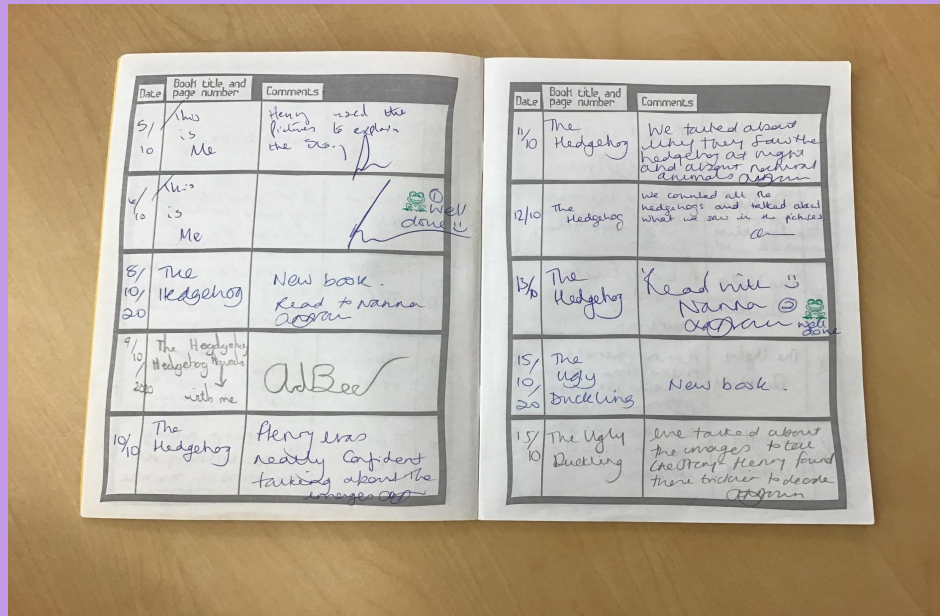
Reading

- Reading books will be changed each week on Thursday evening and sent home in your child's book bag on a Friday. Please ensure reading books are returned on Thursday.
- Please ensure your child always has their reading record in their book bag.
- RIBIT stamps will be awarded each week if your child has read five times in a week. Once your child has 10 stamps they will be able to choose a new book to keep!
- On Friday your child will also bring home a book they have chosen from our reception class library. Please also return on Thursdays.

- We will share and celebrate these moments with the class.



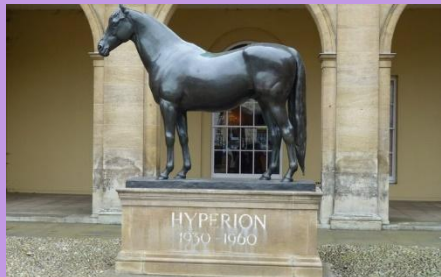
Rewards
